It is good for us to work in collaboration with them and help support those families and individuals who are in great need. There will be a table at the side of the church for your donations and a list of what would be welcomed will be on the table. In the meantime, I have added a list near the end of this newsletter to help as a guide. The demand for food and toiletries has risen sharply - other food banks are reporting the same. So please, it would be appreciated if you could bring in resources whenever you can and leave them in church, or they can be fetched from your home. Thank you so much in anticipation.

If you see someone who may need help do ring this number. There is also helpful information re Energy, Water Bills and Free Broadband. Please keep them to hand and let others have them as you never know when they might be needed - It is so terribly cold at the moment and people are suffering.

Now for something a bit more serious - but hopeful too. I have been made increasingly aware of the numbers of people who are suffering from depression, constant worry, emotional unrest and an inability to let go of past events in their lives they regret. Maybe it is an after-effect of Covid and/or the general unrest in the country and how it is negatively affecting their/our lives. Having been reflecting on this I was completely stopped in my tracks by a passage in Elaine Storkey's newly published book, "Finding God in Matthew. Elaine is a respected theologian and writer who brings an understanding of how Matthew's Gospel links the Old Testament and its prophesies, to the coming of Jesus, recognising his central role in Jewish and human history. But what I want to take from her book in this instance is what she says about the implications, Matthew brings out in the Gospel, for our personal lives and our understanding of how God's Grace can work for any of us whoever we are; can free us if we let it.

Elaine kindly gave me permission to include her observations in the newsletter, just as they are, and I have put them below for you to read and see what you feel. 

"Meeting God in Matthew": an extract on God's Grace - Elaine Storkey

Referring to the generational history of Jesus's ancestors listed at the beginning of Matthew, Elaine observes they were not the most spotless of people, many far from it. She goes on to say,"Matthew lets us see the implications of all this for our personal lives. Jesus's generational history can confirm that God's Grace can work through any of us, whatever our past or present, and bring his purposes to fruition. This list of forebears brings us face-to-face with the fact that the God we meet in Matthew is not a God who blesses us because because of our impeccable ancestral heritage or our devout grandparents. We are blessed because of God's own love for us whoever we are and whatever our background. The realization that God calls us out of any context deepens our understanding of God's power over our former lives. If the past is one we regret, we can face it with God, knowing that we can be forgiven for any sin we have committed in it. If our personal history is so damaged that we feel crippled by it and wake in the night with memories that hurt, God is the one who can release and heal us. The past does matter but it need never have the final word. God's love can bind up our

wounds, restore our spirit and send us out in freedom with renewed steps. So, although the genealogy was to reassure Matthew's Jewish contemporaries it can also lift up our spirits today. It can remind us that the God who wrote the beginning with crooked lines also writes the sequence with crooked lines and some of the lines are our own lives and witness. Even more it helps us see that no one needs to live with the failure of the past when Jesus offers us peace in the present and hope for the future". Ch 1. P8/9
