

Baptism of Christ: Window Southwark Cathedral

Dear Everyone

This Sunday, the second in Epiphany, we celebrate the **Baptism of Christ**, when, according to the Gospel of John, he, seeing Jesus pass by, said, *“I saw the Spirit come down from heaven as a dove and remain on him. And I myself did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water said to me, “He on whom you see the spirit descend and remain is the one who baptizes with the Holy Spirit”*”. In Matthew (3:13-17) it was said that, a voice from heaven was heard saying, *“This is my own dear son with whom I am pleased.”* When this was completed the Heavens opened and the spirit of God descending like a dove alighted on him.



This tells the importance of our own baptisms, joyful occasions of family and friends coming together to witness us being baptised into Jesus the Son of God, receive the Spirit and know that we too are God’s beloved children. A real symbol of the Trinity in our lives of, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The symbolism of the Dove is very strong for us, often beyond Christianity, speaking of Peace that we so badly need in the world today. Something we pray constantly for.

St Paul's Learning Centre

St Paul's Cathedral runs some extremely interesting, thought-provoking sessions on a variety of areas of interest often lasting for 40 minutes in early evening. They are run through their Adult Learning department at the Cathedral which explores Christian life, ethics and spirituality. Their programmes are open to all and includes online events, public debates, reflective study days, meditative services, retreats,

workshops and talks. The next session will be on-line and will take place on **Tuesday 21st March, 6.30-8pm** from the Cathedral. There is no charge for this lecture. I will post the link nearer the time. It will be on: **A History of the Bible: The Book and its Faiths, by Professor John Barton**, who is one of the great Biblical scholars of our time. His definitive book, **"The History of the Bible"**, is the culmination of a lifetime's work. Professor Barton will explore the Bible's long evolution, how much good translations matter, and what contemporary scholarship reveals about the Bible, including how we understand its place at the heart of our faith.

Carting a Carving – Sally

I have always loved carvings, particularly those created in wood. About 8 years ago when I was staying in Northumberland at a retreat house called Shepherds Dene, one of my favourite places, an exhibition of wood carvings was on show all over the house. They were created by a retired priest who was a very gifted sculptor. Outside my bedroom was a smallish statue made of Yew, called the "Music of the Spheres". It had a globe rising from a mound, with a score of music from Handel's Messiah "The Heavens Declare the Glory of God," carved into its back. I kept passing it, looking at it and decided I really wanted it. It was about 2ft 6inches high. I thought I could easily carry it back on the train on top of my suitcase. But when I enquired about it I found that someone had got there before me and had bought it. Not to be deterred I spoke to the sculptor who said he would make me another one that would be similar but I would have to wait until he had found some wood that "spoke" to him regarding the theme. We agreed I would wait, that he would contact me when he had completed it and I would fetch it. I told him that I didn't drive as far as Northumberland and would come by train. All was well – I thought. I had to wait several months until he had found the right wood and completed the carving. I went up to fetch it staying in a hotel in Hexham for a night. He kindly fetched me and drove me to his home, a converted old school, way out in the beautiful Northumberland countryside. His wife made tea and seemed surprised when I said I was going to take it back by train. It was my turn to be surprised, not a little shocked, when he brought it from his studio, to see it was huge by comparison with the original - bigger than a small child and certainly weightier. I could barely lift it and was frantically wondering how I was going to get it back to London. We resolved the question of wrapping by putting it in strong brown paper and securing it with rope. I had brought a large carrier bag! He drove me back to the hotel and lifted it into the entrance. The kindly receptionist called a porter who took it to my room. I did not sleep that night thinking how on earth was I going to get it to the train and home from Kings Cross. There

was no way I could lift it. But, this is where a miracle happened through the kindness of others who recognized my problem and helped with their Northern kindness which I have experiences on other occasions. The receptionist, thinking about it, told me I would be better calling for a taxi to take me direct to Newcastle, the journey wouldn't be that expensive, which I did. The taxi driver was a delight. When I got to the station he lifted it out of his cab and called a porter who put it on a trolley to the train; someone else lifted it in to the train and there it stayed, looking like a corpse, for the rest of the journey – no one asked any questions. On the journey I rang my son, Simon, who was mercifully able to meet me at Kings Cross, take me home and carry it indoors. So, my sculpture got back to London without me having to lift a finger; how lucky was that - but- my goodness, I haven't forgotten the anxiety I felt during that time and will always in future, make sure I make the measurements and weight very clear if I ever have anything like that made for me again. I couldn't help thinking though that there is something to be said about looking helpless and pathetic when necessary!
