Lent: Old Testament Week 5: This Sunday, the focus, (remembering **Creation, Redemption and Restoration,** the three themes running through the bible), was about the fourth book of the Bible, **Numbers**. Numbers records the exodus from oppression in Egypt towards the land God promised to Abraham and his children. The people were numbered, hence the name of the book, and divided into 12 Tribes. The Israelites, having been given the Covenant by God, with many rules to live by, did not keep to them. They were sent to wander in the Wilderness for 40 years with the Tabernacle containing the Laws surrounded by priests and Levites. The 12 Tribes were arranged around it with Judah at its head. Grumble though they did and wanting to go back to Egypt because of the hardship they experienced, God, God provided them with bread and water, showing unwavering faithfulness even when the people were rebellious and breaking the Laws. In Numbers, a prophesy by Ballaam told about a star that would come out of Israel pointing to the coming of the Messiah, (Numbers 24:17). This book is one long adventure of a people's discontent, rebelling against Moses, but really God, and the consequences. Well worth reading!

Diana's funeral was held in Church on Tuesday 08 April 2025. Diana was surrounded by her friends who loved her and will miss her. Members of her family were present, as was Brenda, her long-term friend, who had cared for her so faithfully especially towards the end of her life and was with her when she died. Kamran gave a sermon of appreciation of Diana's life of Faith and Friendship, highlighting how she was the longest term member of the church and much loved. Rose, Alexis and Nwando, accompanied by Geoffrey, led the singing of the hymns that Diana had enjoyed singing. The whole service was an affirmation and appreciation of her long life - a life well lived. In the Eulogies, Keith mentioned her retentive mind and the amount of knowledge she had, which was clearly seen in the games that were played in the over 60's club, which she usually won. She was, without a doubt, the most faithful, loving and long-term member of the congregation who took an interest in everything. Mention was made of the history she had of this church as well as that of the development of the Cricklewood area. She was so full of detail about her life interests and activities. An appreciation was given by members of the congregation, of her friendship, resilience, determination, independence and the interest in and love she had for everyone; but especially her Faith which kept her going with such fortitude. It was so heartening to see so many of the congregation who came to remember her, attend the crematorium and then return to church for refreshments and reminisce about Diana's life.

We will remember all she brought to the church and us, and the qualities she showed. We will remember, above all, what an amazing woman and role model she was. Thank you Diana.

Psalm 46 and comment by Malcolm Guite

Malcolm Guite, one of my favourite Christian poets, says about this psalm, "It is in the context of that reassuring strength and confidence that we can face our fears and deal with what the prayer book calls 'all the changes and chances of this fleeting world', and the times we are in are certainly years in which we



have seen more than our fair share of those "changes and chances".

It is a psalm that can be added to those we we have been collecting and maybe saying each day. How appropriate it is. He then points out, as so often happens in many psalms, that towards the end comes a wonderful prophecy, the vision of God as peacemaker.

Here is Malcolm Guites version.

GOD is our hope and strength: a very present help in trouble;
Therefore will we not fear, though the earth be moved:
and though the hills be carried into the midst of the sea;
Though the waters thereof rage and swell:
and though the mountains shake at the tempest of the same.
The rivers of the flood thereof shall make glad the city of God:
the holy place of the tabernacle of the most Highest.
God is in the midst of her, therefore shall she not be removed:
God shall help her, and that right early.
He maketh wars to cease in all the world:
he breaketh the bow, and knappeth the spear in sunder,
and burneth the chariots in the fire".



Noticing in the Present Reading

Psalm 19.1-6

The heavens are telling the glory of God and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.

One day pours out its song to another and one night unfolds knowledge to another.

They have neither speech nor language and their voices are not heard,

Yet their sound has gone out into all lands and their words to the ends of the world.

In them has he set a tabernacle for the sun,



that comes forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber and rejoices as a champion to run his course. It goes forth from the end of the heavens and runs to the very end again, and there is nothing hidden from its heat.

Reflection

There's a quote by the poet, Ingrid Goff-Maidoff, that simply says 'God spoke today in flowers, and I, who was waiting on words, almost missed the conversation'.

Creation, the natural world, even the tiniest little pockets of it – that's one of our best resources for remembering the hugeness, the joy, the creativity and the beauty of the One who made it all.

If you want to be reminded of the sovereignty of God, look to the skies and remind yourself that every star is there by his command. If you need reminding of his creativity, take a walk and spend five minutes studying the first flower you come across. If you need to trust his ability to provide, go in search of some sparrows.

It's all there, telling the glory of God. Let's not overlook it, let's allow it to fill us with hope.

Challenge

Why not go outside, or look out of a window, and simply notice? All that you see is telling you something about the God that made it, and about you.
